The Friends of Rich Hill have continued to develop interpretive activities for Rich Hill. To date, the following have been completed:

Rich Hill Cabinet Comes Home





The Descendants of the three sons of Lucy Cox Neale have donated the funds to purchase the original glass cabinet that belonged to Lucy Neale's father, Samuel Cox, Jr. The glass cabinet has been given to the Friends of Rich Hill and will eventually be displayed at Rich Hill.

Samuel Cox, Jr., purchased this cabinet sometime before his death in May, 1906.

The small tag on the back of the cabinet indicates delivery was to *H. Townsend*, Railroad Agent, with the destination to *Cox* in *Bel Alton. If not delivered in 16 days, notify 925 Homan Avenue, Chicago, ILL.*

Howard Townshend was the Railroad Agent at Cox's Station prior to 1910. 925 S. Homan Avenue was the Sears, Roebuck & Company Complex in Chicago.

The *Friends of Rich Hill* was established to preserve, promote, and restore a unique part of Southern Maryland's heritage. Rich Hill was built in 1729 by Dr. Gustavus Brown, one of the wealthiest men in the Maryland colony. More notably, it was the home of Colonel Samuel Cox, who hid John Wilkes Booth and David Herold in his "pine thicket" in the days following the assassination of President Abraham Lincoln in April of 1865.

The Purpose of the Friends of Rich Hill is to:

- Develop interpretive activities to tell the many stories of Rich Hill.
- Collect interior furnishings & accessories.
- Host special events at Rich Hill.
- Provide updates on the rehabilitation progress.
- Create partnerships with other organizations.


